Do you love food and eating; do you enjoy art – drawing of fruit or vegetables, or mandalas etc; printmaking, and bookbinding?

Let us create a joint book of our favourite recipes along with beautiful art work.

Share your favourite recipe, tell us where it comes from, how you cook it, when (special occasions or everyday food?), where you get the ingredients and spices from, and how you eat it.

There are 10 spaces available for Syrian students and 10 spaces for adult learners, altogether 20. There are 3 tutors who will run the project with knowledge in cookery, bookmaking, drawing, painting, photography and printmaking.

What do you need to bring:

Enthusiasm, commitment and a typical spice for the first day - Monday 8th August.

On Tuesday 9th August please bring ingredients for your favourite dish (and possibly some specific cookery utensils) and demonstrate how you cook it.
